XXXV. Matthew 24: Deception Without Speculative Overconfidence

Matthew 24 warns of false Christs, false prophets, signs, wonders and deceptive reports while also emphasizing watchfulness. The lesson is not that every strange technology must be fulfillment. It is to know what Christ said, resist deception and remain watchful without converting every novelty into a prophetic certainty.

XXXVI. Prophecy Versus Divination by Popular Culture

Studying propaganda, symbolism, occult imagery and institutional influence is legitimate. A danger appears when every film, game, logo, commercial, dream and coincidence becomes an encrypted oracle from which hidden futures are read. A future claim becomes stronger when it contains a dated prediction made before the event; identifies unusual specific features rather than generic motifs; records failed predictions alongside apparent hits; demonstrates intentional relationships among creators and alleged planners; produces documentary evidence of coordination; rules out genre inheritance and ordinary cultural influence; and allows some conceivable evidence to count against the hypothesis.

A theory that survives only because every possible outcome is reinterpreted as confirmation has ceased functioning as an investigation.
